Welcome to the **Introduction to DHIS2** course, part of the DHIS2 Fundamentals course program. We at the DHIS2 Academy Team want to thank you for your interest in DHIS2 and hope this course provides you with a helpful overview of the DHIS2 software and some of its common uses that can serve as the foundation for your DHIS2 learning journey.

What will I learn?

After completing this course, you'll be able to:

- Identify examples of the use of DHIS2 in the implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of public health programs.
- Recognize how DHIS2 can be used to capture, analyze, and share data to make informed decisions in public health and other fields.
- Identify the DHIS2 building blocks that make it possible to customize and extend the capabilities of the platform.
- Indicate DHIS2 advantages as open-source software and its potential for integration with other platforms.
- Recognize the roles and the relationship between the University of Oslo (UiO) and the Health Information Systems Programme (HISP) to create, develop, apply, and improve DHIS2 in the context of Global Digital Health programs.
- Distinguish the elements that comprise the DHIS2 ecosystem and the ways to interact with the DHIS2 global community.

What are the course prerequisites?

There are no specific prerequisites to do this course.

How will I learn?

In each module, you will find video presentations, demonstrations, readings, and knowledge check questions.



Each topic is presented in the form of videos of approximately 4 to 7 minutes in length. Watch them at your leisure (or download them to save them for later), participate in the discussions, and see how much you've learned by taking the assignments afterward.

How long will it take to complete the course?

To pass the course, an overall grade of 80% is required.

Academy Certification

To get the course certificate, you need to achieve a **passing grade of 80% or more**. To check your current grade, go to the **Progress** page in the top menu and review your score. When you achieve a passing grade, the option to claim your certificate will appear at the top of the page. Once you claim the certificate, you can print it and share it with your social and professional networks
